- ❖ Donna – retired from a community college in Kentucky, used the product for 12 years as a supplemental support for students
 - Students and teachers have the same view
 - Students had to take a placement test upon entering the institution, and some of the students were not ready for college writing. They would take the English class and had to take a supplemental lab, MyLab Writing. (This was a course they had to pay for and received credit).
 - Path Builder – builds a path for each student based on a diagnostic (test). The student works on what they need, and can move to something else once they have mastered the topic.
 - Basic Grammar – parts of speech, subject and verbs, nouns, pronouns, articles, verbs, tense, regular and irregular verbs, modifiers, adjectives and adverbs,
 - Sentence Skills
 - Punctuation, Mechanics, and Spelling
 - Usage and Style
 - Each section provides an overview in a PDF (audio enabled)
 - Video – meat of the topic
 - Homework or Lessons
 - Once student has mastered a section, he or she will receive a star and the grade will automatically transfer to the teacher’s grade book.
 - Students have the ability to check their work before submitting, and it tells you why the answer is correct or incorrect.
 - Students can pick up where they left off.
 - The teachers can set the mastery level and the number of attempts. (Donna sets her mastery at 70%)
 - Application
 - Writing Activity
 - Post-Test (80% is set for mastery)
 - There is a post test for ALL topics in a given section
 - Writing Practice does not have a path builder, because the section is loaded with writing prompts. The students can choose a topic to write on – one in which they are interested.
- ❖ Question – Tenir Gumbs – Do students have to complete all parts of the module before moving to the next topic?

- ❖ Answer – Donna – No. It is dependent on the institution and the faculty member, and how you set things up.
- ❖ Gradebook
 - Shows how long a student spends on an assignment
 - Instructor can review what the student submitted.
 - There is a model answer provided that the instructor can send to the student
 - Action items – item analysis
 - Shows topics and objectives
- ❖ Writing Solutions
 - Manage Assignments – Writing Assignments
 - New Assignment (Create – follow the prompts)
 - Can create a prompt or choose a prompt
 - If you choose a prompt, you can choose it by discipline
 - Can create a rubric or choose a rubric
 - Instructor can change how the assignment is graded
 - Instructor can train the system to grade like you – after scoring 20 submissions.
 - System can also grade the paper automatically
 - Instructor can choose citation style
 - Length (none or 250-500 words)
 - Plagiarism checker
 - Choose where the assignment should be located
 - Choose the mastery level
- ❖ Matt – Data Guy
 - ****WORKING ON AN INTEGRATION WITH GRAMMARLY!****
 - Data we are looking for as an institution - proficiency, time spent using the resource, and are student reaching the set benchmark (Dr. Martin)
 - All of the information can be found in the gradebook
 - Scores in the gradebook are preset, but can be changed
 - Results can be viewed by: learning path, assignments, student, performance overview
 - Data sets can be exported
 - Homework, Test, Learning Path Summaries
 - *Reports can take up to 24 hours*
 - There is a dashboard that lives outside of MyLab, with Pearson, and it can show everything! (Automated report)
