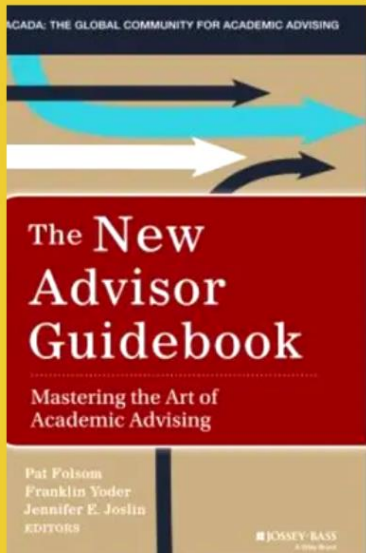

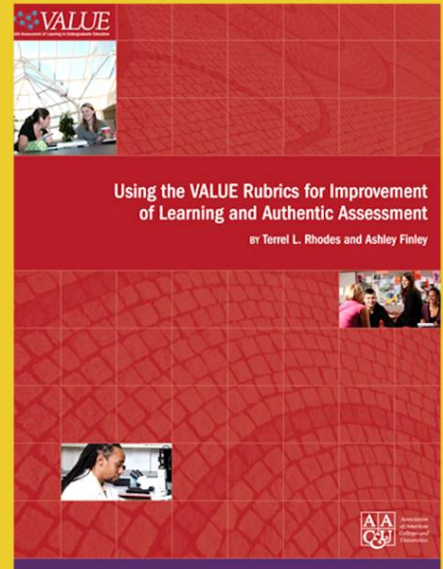

## We are constantly learning!

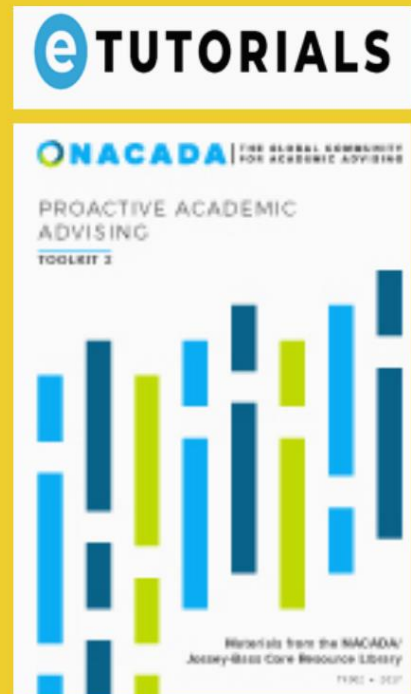
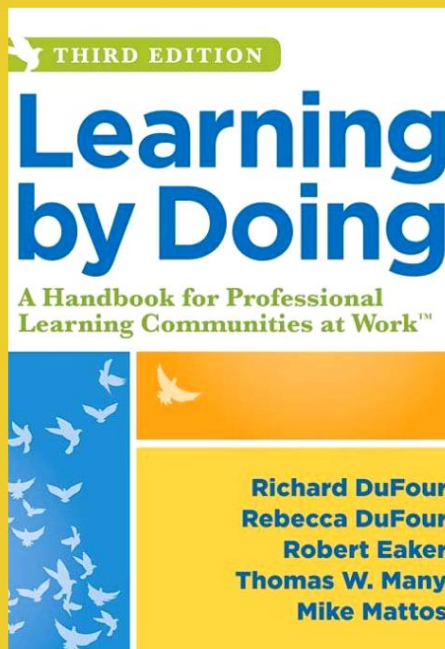
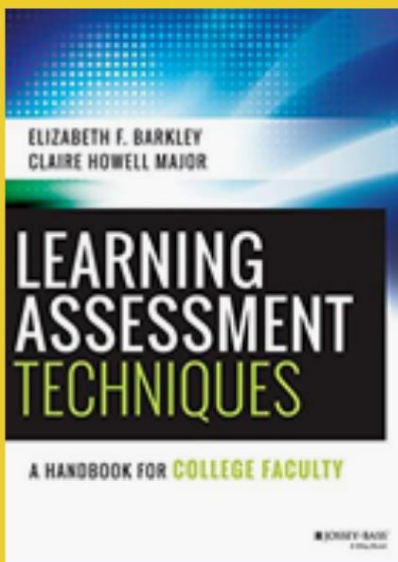
For one consecutive year, we have researched, studied, and implemented best practices from a variety of research-based professional development resources.
