According to Hanover Research, **Institutional retention strategies** include internal operations undertaken by the institution that can be applied across the student body.

- Institutional Retention Strategies: internal operations undertaken by the institution that can be applied across the student body.
- Student Services Strategies: programs that target individuals or select groups and often rely on student participation or opt-in.

Used in tandem, higher education institutions can ensure they are creating an environment that supports student success and has safeguards in place to keep students on track.

- Focus on undergraduate teaching and learning
- Track persistence patterns across all students
- Identify difficult courses
- Assess student satisfaction
- Assess current student needs
- Set measurable retention goals
- Track retention rates for specific programs
- Monitor progress in the learning management system
- Statistically predict student success
- Title III or V Funding
- Use financial aid targeted at retention
